

Context

From April to August 2025, UNHCR Sub-office of Mopti witnessed a steady influx of refugees from the villages of Burkina Faso. These people fled following attacks and the reinforced presence of armed groups on the outskirts of their localities. Some 7,000 refugees arrived in the first few weeks of April, and more than 11,000 joined them in early August. UNHCR is working alongside the authorities and the humanitarian community to mobilize a joint and coordinated emergency response which will require additional resources to meet the urgent needs of the refugees and reduce the pressure on generous host communities and fragile public services.

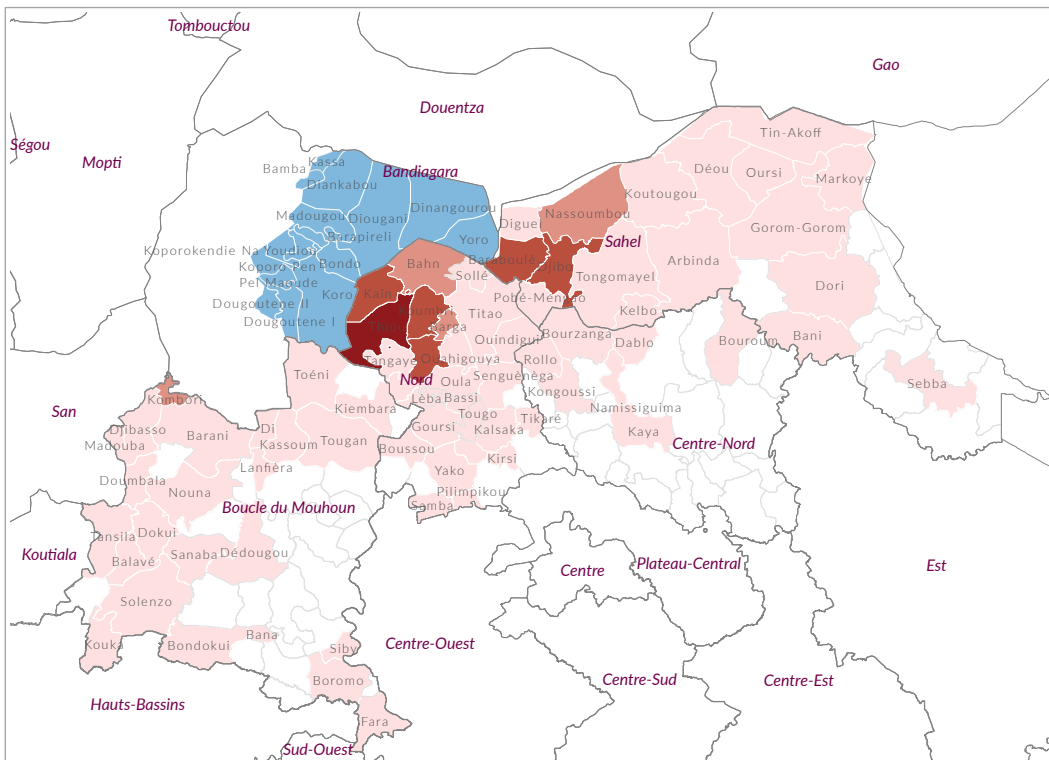

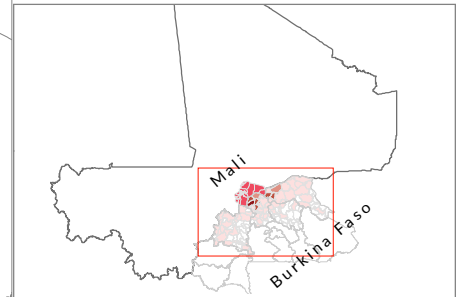

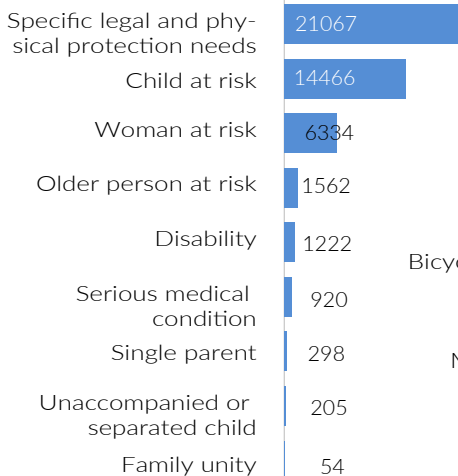

Geographical information (refugee's area of origin in Burkina Faso)


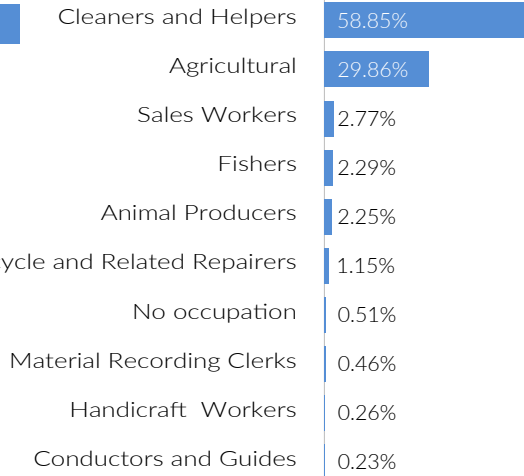
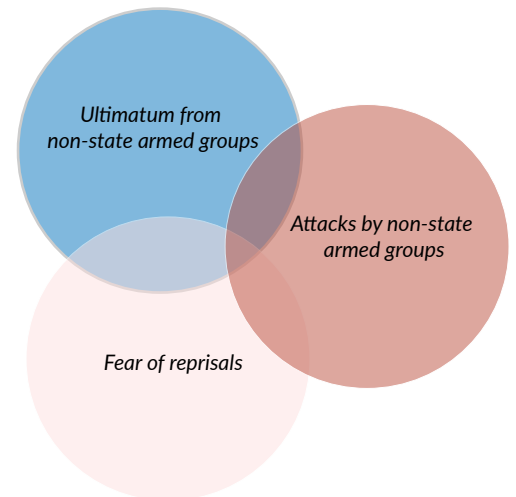
